Historic Lincoln Park

The small triangular piece of land bordered by Broad, Lincoln and Grove Streets was made into a park in the mid-1880s. Wishing to perpetuate the memory of the honored dead of the Civil War, the Alexander Wilkin Post, Grand Army of the Republic placed a bronze monument of a Civil War private soldier holding a musket at parade rest on a pedestal in the center of a stone basin. At each corner of the basin were ram's heads from which water would flow.

A dedication ceremony was held on Memorial Day, 1893. The soldier's monument was called the *Boy in Blue*. The *Boy in Blue* graced the park until 1911 when it was damaged by vandals.

On Tuesday, July 5, 2011, the Mankato Area Community Band presented “When Billy Comes Marching Home” patriotic concert at Mankato’s historic Lincoln Park (Lincoln, Grove and Broad Street intersection).

The concert commemorated the 150th Anniversary of the outbreak of the American Civil War (2011-2015). A special announcement was made regarding an effort to recreate the *Boy in Blue* statue and fountain that once graced Mankato’s Lincoln Park.

On August 30, 2011 on the front lawn of the Lincoln Community Center, members of the Boy in Blue Project Committee were on hand at the annual Lincoln Park neighborhood Night to Unite to answer questions about the statue and its history, as well as to officially kick-off efforts to receive financial contributions for the project. Photos were on display for the Boy in Blue project and brochures available.

Mankato's famous literary daughter, **Maud Hart Lovelace**, grew up several blocks from Lincoln Park. In an article written for the "I Remember Mankato" series published in the *Mankato Free Press* in 1952, Maud wrote, "*As we grew older we made more trips downtown, pausing to play by the fountain at Lincoln Park or rest under the big elm there.*" The little park and the fountain was an important landmark in Maud's Betsy-Tacy books.
