After 40 years in active ministry as a parish pastor and hospital chaplain, the author has assimilated 52 sermons which project a pastoral concern for a broken world. Such topics as forgiveness, pain, suffering, alienation, reconciliation, death and resurrection give hope to those hurt and crushed by life's experiences.
